UMCOR responds to natural or civil disasters that are interruptions of such magnitude overwhelm that thev community's ability to recover on its own.

Many of you have been giving to UMCOR for quite some time; others may just be learning about the tremendous scope of the organization's outreach. 

Planet vs. Plastics: A Battle Cry for Earth Day 2024

Mark your calendars for April 22, 2024, because Earth Day is gearing up for an epic showdown: Planet vs. Plastics. This year's theme is a rallying cry to tackle the burgeoning plastic pollution crisis head on, demanding a 60% reduction in plastic production by 2040.

- Reduce your plastic footprint: Choose products with minimal packaging and avoid unnecessary plastic purchases.
- Recycle responsibly: Make sure you're recycling the right types of plastic in the correct way.
- Support sustainable businesses: Choose brands committed to reducing their plastic footprint and invest in reusable products.
- Spread the word: Talk to your friends, family, and community about the plastic pollution crisis and inspire them to take action.
